

VACANCY – FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT

An opportunity has become available for a **Crew Commander/ Operations** reporting to the **Platoon Commander**. The successful incumbent will be based at Lanseria International Airport.

AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Saving of lives and property and the prevention of fire.
- Providing a humanitarian service to all airport users
- Operate Airport equipment and vehicles as required. (FT-1, 2, 5, 6, 10)
- Supervise crew members in their daily duties.
- Take the lead and give guidance to crew members under your control at an emergency incident.
- Be responsible and accountable for all vehicles, equipment, and personnel under your control.
- Respond to medical emergencies as required.
- Perform duties as per RFFS duty roster and Standard Operating Procedures.
- Supervise daily station duties.
- Ensure that daily station duties are performed in accordance with the Daily Duty Roster.
- Crew administration.
- Ensure that vehicles and equipment under your control is properly inspected, maintained and operational while on duty.
- Provide the necessary in-house training to personnel under your command.
- Ensure that the necessary fire safety inspections of airport installations and buildings are done in accordance with the Fire Safety Program.
- Ensure that the necessary fire and rescue competencies are maintained in accordance with Civil Aviation Regulations Part 139.02. and ICAO Doc 9137 – AN/898 Part 1 and ICAO Doc 7192 – AN/857 Part E2 and LIA RFFS Standards.
- Take over the duties of the Duty Officer in his absence.
- Ensure that crew members under your control wear the required PPE while attending to emergency calls and during training sessions.
- General Airport safety.
- Maintain crew discipline and morale.
- Attend meetings as required.
- Perform any lawful and reasonable instruction from an Officer or the Airport Executive Operations Manager.

- Identify at least ten types of aircraft, make and model, and be familiar with technical data and escape and rescue procedures.
- Be familiar with the topography within a 10 km radius around the Airport including access routes to areas at the end of each runway.
- Be familiar with aircraft flight location and ATC terms, i.e. long finals, short finals, left downwind, right downwind, base leg and overhead etc.
- Know the location of all fire hydrants at the Airport.
- Know the lay out, location of all firefighting equipment and occupancies of all offices, public and retail areas in the Airport Terminal building.
- Know the general Airport lay out and the numbers, location, and occupancies of all hangars.
- Be familiar with all SOP's and work instructions relevant to your job output.
- Know and be familiar with all the high-risk areas at the Airport.
- Know the topography and landmarks within a 10km radius of the Airport.
- Know and be familiar with the layout and location of firefighting equipment at the Bulk Fuel storage area and the static fuel pump at the Fuel Department offices.
